## What is the project about?

#### What are the potential benefits of the research project?

There are no benefits anticipated for participants, however, this research will help us to better understand how housing affects children's health and well-being. This may inform future beneficial interventions with the aim of improving the health and well-being of many Australians.

### What will happen to my information?

This survey is conducted on behalf of the research project by EY Sweeney. EY Sweeney are accredited to the international standard for market and social research, ISO 20252, which is a testament to their commitment to best practice.

Confidentiality and privacy: Your survey responses will be provided to the University of Adelaide Researchers mentioned below by EY Sweeney in anonymized form.

Storage: Survey responses will be securely stored electronically on password protected University of Adelaide facilities that are only accessible to the research team via University of Adelaide's student/staff id. EY Sweeney will also store survey responses on their secure servers. Data will be stored for at least 5 years. Anonymised survey responses will be shared with the Australian Data Archive so that it can be safely used by other researchers.

*Publishing:* Any results reported in resulting publications will be aggregated with no identifiable information included. Publications and outputs from the research may include academic journal articles, book chapters, conference presentations, and/or media reports.
