EARLY CAREER RESEARCHER PRIZE
for the best publication in 2021

Deadline: 14 January 2022

The School of Humanities Research Committee invites applications to the Early Career Researcher Prize for the Best Publication in 2021.

Award

- The annual value of the Prize is \$1,000 in research support funding. If more than one applicant is awarded the prize, this amount will be apportioned equally between prize winners. Awarded prize monies will be administered by the Faculty Support Officer and can be claimed for legitimate research expenses. Prize winners will also receive a Certificate of Award.

Eligibility

- For the purposes of this prize, 'Early Career Researchers' are defined as academics who:
 - Have a PhD
 - Were employed in some capacity (including casual, fixed-term or continuing) within the School of Humanities during 2021
 - Have had no more than five years full-time employment in a role that includes a research component at any institution
- Eligible works include any academic or creative publication in print or digital format authored by an ECR and published between 1 January 2021 and 31 December 2021
- The Prize is for ECR authored works only; edited volumes are not eligible
- The ECR should be either sole or lead author of the publication (if lead author of a multi-authored work, please append a brief authorship statement to your nomination detailing your leading contribution)
- Advance or 'online first' publications are not eligible and should be submitted in the year in which they are published in print or in an online volume
- Only one publication can be submitted for consideration in any given year.

Application Procedure

- Applications should be submitted as email attachments to: humanitiesoffice@adelaide.edu.au
- Applications must include:
 - An electronic copy of the publication
 - A completed nomination form (attached), including a brief research statement that contextualises the publication within the applicant's research career and discusses its significance, originality, impact and engagement within their field of research
- Deadline: COB 14 January 2022.

Evaluation Criteria

- Applications will be evaluated on the following factors:
 - Research excellence and/or impact and engagement
 - Significance and originality of the research within the applicant's field of research
 - Accessibility of the research to other disciplines in the humanities
 - Achievement within the context of the applicant's career.

Judging Procedure

- The prize is judged by the School of Humanities Research Committee, which will nominate further judges from the relevant disciplines if deemed necessary.

Announcement

- The prize will be announced at the School of Humanities Planning Day in February 2022.
