

A NOTE FROM THE HEAD OF MUSIC THEATRE

The only books I truly enjoy reading are those about music theatre history. I can sit for hours in a coffee shop devouring some 'gossipy' tale about the backstory of a Broadway musical. Anyone who will listen to me for any period of time is usually subjected to some historical anecdote about a Broadway show. It's one of the reasons I have so few friends.

Recently, I have been reading about Barry and Fran Weissler, originally small-time producers from New Jersey who staged the ground-breaking 1996 revival of *Chicago*. No one believed in the concept for the revival. No one wanted to invest in the show. The Weissler's committed the cardinal sin of producing theatre and invested their own money. Everyone made fun of Barry Weissler. A university dropout who failed more courses than he passed.

Barry Weissler said he was lost as a young man until he stumbled upon theatre. Watching a rehearsal of Shakespeare's *Measure for Measure*, he said he found his people, and was comfortable for the first time in his life. Together with his wife Fran, they took all the knockbacks and rejections but refused to give up. Mortgaging their house, they rolled the dice on *Chicago*. Since 1996, the Broadway gross alone for *Chicago* currently stands at over \$700 million. The Weissler's have won 7 Tony Awards and 4 Drama Desk Awards. *Chicago* is still running on Broadway!

Why does this story matter? Because theatre of any kind, no matter the level, takes courage. A school teacher to a professional producer will all tell the same tale. It's a total joy...and it's hard!

Last month I announced our 2024 season. Putting together a season of shows feels a bit like trying to juggle flaming torches while riding a unicycle on a tightrope strung across a volcano. Impossible to completely please anyone, and a certainty that at some point I will annoy and dismay everyone.

In 2024, our graduating Third-Year students begin the year in the quaint 19th-century world of *Little Women*, where corsets are tight, and gossip is loose. Exploring themes of sisterhood and resilience, this stunning musical score is an absolute treat. In stark contrast, the rock opera *Jesus Christ Superstar* depicting the last week of Jesus' life, will provide an opportunity for students to delve into complex characters, aggressive choreography and emotionally charged musical numbers.

With a South Australian premiere, our Second-Year students will tackle the glorious new work *Alice by Heart*. From the team that created *Spring Awakening*, we follow Alice who takes refuge in a London Tube station during the Blitz of WWII. Here she confronts grief, loss, and love with the help of her favourite book, *Alice in Wonderland*.

We finish the year with our graduating class in the often hilarious and heartbreaking complexities of Sondheim's *Company*. In this ground-breaking work, relationships are dissected and emotions run high as we follow Bobby and his pursuit of love and relationships.

If you are delighted, surprised, perplexed and annoyed then I have done a good job. Bring on 2024!

FROM THE DIRECTOR

When I found out I was to be working with the first and second year ECMT students on *Shrek The Musical*, I was 300 performances into a run of *Phantom of the Opera* with Opera Australia. I'd spent months in the world of the grotesque. I was surrounded by the gothic and the dramatic. I didn't realise it at the time, but after all that epic grandeur and opulence, I desperately needed to explore the Big Bright Beautiful world of a musical like *Shrek*.

And boy, did it deliver.

Building a show with the students of the Elder Conservatorium of Music's Bachelor of Music Theatre is a beautiful experience. Each rehearsal is filled with a company of young performers who demonstrate an eagerness to learn and a tenacity to strive for improvement in newly acquired skills. But most strikingly, there is a sense of fun, a sense of play and an incredible sense of community.

It is this community - this sense of togetherness - which has made the rehearsal process for the production so joyous. Not only did it feed into the thematic material of the work, which explores discovering community in the most unexpected places, but it created a beautiful link between art and reality.

The world of *Shrek* is populated with a plethora of interesting and vibrant characters: an ogre, a Princess, a Dragon, a donkey and a collection of well known fairy tale characters. It is zany, satirical, heartfelt and subversive weaving an array of musical styles,

theatrical conventions and dance numbers into one colourful landscape and forces us to reflect on some large social justice issues which are - sadly - still incredibly relevant. In fact, whenever there is work to be done in the areas of social justice, discrimination, human rights and mental health, the underlying messages found within *Shrek The Musical* will be relevant.

Shrek explores connection and diversity, celebrating both of these ideas by challenging stereotypes, parodying established tropes and subverting the norm. Its beating heart, however, is the beautiful community bringing it to life.

DAVID LINDSAY-ABAIRE Book and Lyrics

David Lindsay-Abaire is a Pulitzer Prize winning playwright, screenwriter, lyricist and librettist. *Ripcord*, opened at Manhattan Theatre Club in 2015. His previous play *Good People* premiered on Broadway, was awarded the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Play, The Horton Foote Prize, The Edgerton Foundation New American Play Award, and two Tony nominations. His play *Rabbit Hole* received the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, five Tony nominations, and the Spirit of America Award. David also wrote the book and lyrics for *Shrek The Musical*, which was nominated for eight Tonys, four Oliviers, a Grammy, and earned David the Ed Kleban Award as America's most promising musical theatre lyricist. David's other plays include Fuddy Meers, Kimberly Akimbo, Wonder of the World, and A Devil Inside, among others.

In addition to his work in theatre, David's screen credits include his film adaptation of *Rabbit Hole*, DreamWorks' *Rise of the Guardians*, and *Family Fang*, starring Nicole Kidman, Christopher Walken and Jason Bateman.





JEANINE TESORI Music

Jeanine Tesori won the Tony Award for Best Original Score with Lisa Kron for the musical Fun Home. She has also written Tony-nominated scores for Twelfth Night at Lincoln Center; Thoroughly Modern Millie (lyrics, Dick Scanlan); Caroline, or Change (lyrics, Tony Kushner); and Shrek The Musical (lyrics, David Lindsay-Abaire). The production of Caroline, or Change at the National Theatre in London received the Olivier Award for Best New Musical. Her 1997 Off-Broadway musical Violet (lyrics, Brian Crawley) opened on Broadway in 2014 and garnered four Tony nominations, including Best Musical Revival. Opera: A Blizzard on Marblehead Neck (libretto, Tony Kushner; Glimmerglass) and

The Lion, The Unicorn, and Me (libretto, J. D. McClatchy, Kennedy Center). Music for plays: Mother Courage (dir. George C. Wolfe, with Meryl Streep and Kevin Kline), John Guare's A Free Man of Color (Lincoln Center Theater, dir. George C. Wolfe), and Romeo and Juliet (Delacorte Gala). Film scores: Nights in Rodanthe, Every Day, and You're Not You. Ms. Tesori is a member of the Dramatists Guild and was cited by the ASCAP as the first female composer to have two new musicals running concurrently on Broadway. She was the founding artistic director of Encores! Off-Center at New York City Center, and a lecturer in music at Yale University. Most of all, she is the proud parent of Siena Rafter.



JASON MOORE Original Director

Broadway: Avenue Q, Steel Magnolias. Carnegie Hall: Jerry Springer: The Opera. Off-Broadway: Speech and Debate (Roundabout), Avenue Q (the Vineyard), Guardians (the Culture Project), The Crumple Zone. Associate directing: Les Misérables (Broadway, national tour), *Ragtime* (Vancouver). Writer: *The Floatplane Notebooks* (Charlotte Repertory Theatre). TV directing: episodes of *Dawson's Creek, Everwood, One Tree Hill,* and *Brothers and Sisters.* Jason has a BS in performance studies from Northwestern University.



Rob Ashford Original Director

Rob Ashford won the 2012 Olivier Award for his production of Anna Christie starring Jude Law and Ruth Wilson at London's Donmar Warehouse. The production opened to rave reviews with The Independent's anointing it as "picture perfect" and David Benedict stating that "the production's hallmark is its boldness." Rob most recently directed the Broadway revival of Cat on a Hot Tin Roof starring Scarlett Johansson, and Macbeth with Sir Kenneth Branagh at New York's Park Avenue Armory and The Manchester International Festival. The Telegraph claimed "This is a Macbeth that won't just go down as a highlight of the Manchester International Festival but as one of the Scottish Plav's great revivals," and Ben Brantley of the New York Times proclaimed "Mr. Ashford uses his experience as a celebrated director of musicals to stunning, time-bending effect." Rob received his 8th Tony Nomination for his work on the Broadway revival of Evita starring Ricky Martin, and received the Tony Award for his work on the Broadway production of Thoroughly Modern Millie. Other Broadway credits include How to Succeed in Business (Tony Award nominations for his direction and choreography), Promises, Promises (Tony Award nomination), Shrek, John Water's Cry Baby (Tony Award nomination,

Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, and Fred Astaire Awards), Curtains (Tony Award nomination), and Wedding Singer (Tony Award nomination). In London, Rob also directed the highly acclaimed Olivier Award winning revivals of A Streetcar Named Desire starring Rachel Weisz and Parade at The Donmar Warehouse. Rob did the choreography and staging for the Academy Awards with Seth MacFarlane and won the 2009 Emmy Award for Best Choreography for his work on Baz Luhrmann's production number (featuring Hugh Jackman and Beyoncé) at the 81st Annual Academy Awards. He has also choreographed the opening number for The Tony Awards starring Neil Patrick Harris for 4 years. He choreographed the feature film *Beyond The Sea* directed by and starring Academy Award winner Kevin Spacey and Walt Disney Production's film Cinderella directed by Kenneth Branagh. Rob directed and choreographed NBC's The Sound of Music Live!, for which he received a DGA Award Nomination, and directed The Barber of Seville at Chicago Lyric Opera. Rob is an Associate Director at The Old Vic Theatre. He also serves on the Executive Board of The Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers and is a Trustee of The Joyce Theatre in New York City.





ERIN JAMES

A graduate of the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (Music Theatre), Erin's professional career began as a performer in some of Australia's most popular musicals including Opera Australia's productions of *My Fair Lady, South Pacific, The King and I,* as well as various Australian and international tours of CATS, Fiddler on The Roof, Blood Brothers, and Love Never Dies, among others. Her work in the arts extends to film and television, and Erin was fortunate enough to receive AACTA Award and Film Critics Circle of Australia Award nominations for her role in the feature film *The Little Death* (2014).

After working as a dance captain, swing and assistant director for the last decade. her professional directorial debut came in 2018 with She Loves Me at Haves Theatre Co, which received Sydney Theatre Awards and Broadway World Award nominations. She was promoted to Staging Supervisor for Julie Andrew's production of My Fair Lady (Opera Australia), worked as Assistant Director for Vernon God Little (2014) and Stalking The Bogeyman (2018) and the Resident Director for the 2022/23 Australian tour of Phantom of the Opera (Opera Australia) at the Sydney Opera House and Arts Centre Melbourne. She directed the CONDA Award winning production of Mamma Mia! 2019 and The Very Popular Theatre Company's CHESS in Concert, starring Silvie Paladino and David Harris, in 2021.

As an educator and theatre practitioner, Erin has worked with Elder Conservatorium of Music's Music Theatre program to direct *On the Town* (2023), *Les Misérables* (2022), *Cabaret* (2021), and *Showcase: Our Time* (2021) and she is thrilled to return to ECMT for *Shrek The Musical*.

Erin is currently starring in Anna Goldsworthy's new play *Welcome To Your New Life* for State Theatre Company of South Australia.





JOSEPH SIMONS Choreographer

Joseph is a director and choreographer working in music theatre, contemporary dance, opera, theatre and ballet.

After graduating from Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA), Joseph was awarded 2009 Outstanding Emerging Artist at Australian Dance Awards and nominated for a Green Room Award for Best Male Dancer.

As a performer, he has toured throughout USA, Asia, UK and Australia with companies including West Australian Ballet (Pinocchio title role), Chunky Move (Connected, I Like This), Lucy Guerin Inc. (Structure and Sadness, Untrained), Queensland Ballet (Little Red), Force Majeure (I Will Have Beautiful People At My Funeral Too), Jack Productions and The Australian Ballet (El Amour Brujo). He has performed with The Production Company (Nice Work If You Can Get It), Opera Australia (The Ring Cycle, King Roger), Victorian Opera (Julius Caesar) and developed work at Australian Dance Theatre (Proximity) and DV8 Physical Theatre, London (John). As an actor, Joseph played Tom in the original London cast of Spider Love by Mick Goldstein and created the role of Malcom in the world premiere cast of The Death Of Kings by Colette F Keen.

His choreography has been performed by West Australian Ballet (*Man Alive*), Footlight Productions (*Miss Saigon*), The Seven Sopranos (*Popcorn*), Queensland University of Technology (*Skank: A Tragic Love Story*), Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (*Self Destruct*) and Flying Fruit Fly Circus (*Storm*) as well as music videos for Elisha Bones' *Guts* and Hounds Homebound's *Sandy*. Joseph was the recipient of the 2013 Tanya Liedtke Fellowship – awarded to one Australian choreographer every two years.

Following his residency at the International Choreographic Laboratory in Frankfurt, Joseph created his solo work *First Things First*, premiering in the Robert Helpmann Theatre at the Margot Fonteyn Academy in New York. His next play, 100 Years Of The History Of Dance As Told By One Man In 60 Minutes With An Energetic Group Finale, was written during a development at Roundabout Theatre, New York, before touring extensively.

From 2015 Joseph has been a contributing creative with Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University on shows including *Carousel, Little Women, Company, The Wedding Singer, Legally Blonde, Personals, It's Only Life,* and *Elegies.*

Joseph directed and choreographed the sold out and extended production of *The Producers* in Brisbane, Queensland. He was the Artistic Director of Altitude Theatre before becoming a full-time lecturer in Music Theatre at Elder Conservatorium, University of Adelaide.



PAUL SINKINSON Music Director

Paul has been with the Bachelor of Music Theatre since inception as repertoire coach and accompanist. Show credits as a resident music director include Shrek, In Pieces, Mamma Mia!, Songs for a New World and Spring Awakening. Paul brings industry experience as a keyboard deputy and pit musician from national tours including 9 to 5, Frozen, Mamma Mia!, The Sound of Music and Singin' In The Rain. He was the Associate Music Director for the national tour of Friends! The Musical Parody and has worked on a plethora of state based productions as music director including This Girl: Regional SA Cabaret Tour (Rachael Beck), Kinky Boots (Gilbert & Sullivan Society of SA). Avenue Q (Hills Musical Company), Chitty Chitty Bang Bang (Northern Light Theatre Company), Bye Bye Birdie (The MET), Wicked (Matt Byrne Media) and Mary Poppins (Whyalla Players). Paul holds a Masters of Secondary Education in Media and Music and directs the social choir program Sing for Joy across the state for the aged care provider ACH Group.

She has worked as a horror actor for *The Living Dead Experience*, performed with Trevor Jones at his Piano Bar in the *Adelaide Cabaret Festival*, was part of the 2023 Adelaide Fringe Award Winning *BIMBO* (2021-23, dir. Amelia Rooney and Hannah Smith) and *Songs and Scenes* (ECMT, dir. Joseph Simons).



Sascha Debney-Matiszik (he/him) Pied Piper / Captain of the Guard / Ensemble

Shrek will be Sascha's second production with ECMT, the first being a featured soloist in Songs and Scenes: Magic, Myths and Monsters (dir. Joseph Simons). Originally from Sydney, Sascha performed in Pricilla, Queen of the Desert (Willoughby Theatre Company, dir. 
Sally Harrop (she/her) Tooth Fairy / Ensemble
