

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Satire. It makes us laugh, but it also makes us look closer. Comedy has a way of slipping under our guard, exposing what might otherwise be too uncomfortable to name. In *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying*, Frank Loesser and his collaborators take aim at ambition, corporate culture, and the pursuit of success at all costs. More than sixty years later, it feels less like a time capsule and more like a mirror.

What gives the show its power is not simply its wit, but its humanity. Finch, our charmingly unscrupulous protagonist, ultimately realises that climbing ladders without compassion leaves us empty. In the end, it is humanity (not titles or corner offices) that matters most. That reminder feels particularly resonant in our current world.

For our third-year Music Theatre students, this production is both a final milestone and a launchpad. They have not only rehearsed, sung, and danced their way through these weeks, but also stepped into the shoes of producers, designers, choreographers, and stage managers. They have learned that theatre is never the work of one, but the work of many. In wearing these multiple hats, they have proven themselves not just as performers, but as adaptable, generous theatre-makers

It has been a privilege to watch this cohort grow into artists who understand that comedy can be biting and tender at once, and that satire, at its core, always circles back to what connects us as humans. As they leave us and step into the professional world, I am proud to know they carry that lesson forward.

SYNOPSIS

ACT ONE

J. Pierrepont Finch, an ambitious New York window washer, discovers the book How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying and follows its advice as he enters the World Wide Wicket Company to apply for a job (How to Succeed).

He bumps into company president J.B. Biggley and personnel manager Mr. Bratt, eventually landing a mailroom job alongside Bud Frump, Biggley's lazy, yet conniving nephew. Lovestruck secretary Rosemary Pilkington quickly imagines a future with Finch (Happy to Keep His Dinner Warm).

One week later, panic spreads when the office coffee runs out, leaving employees without their daily caffeine fix (Coffee Break) and Finch charms J.B. Biggley's nonnesses secretary, Miss Jones.

In the mailroom, longtime employee Mr. Twimble gives Finch his own personal advice on how to succeed in business (The Company Way). When he is offered a promotion within the mailroom, Finch, on the advice of his trusty guidebook to success, turns it down and magnanimously suggests the position be given to his arch enemy Bud Frump. Frump, not knowing any better, is thrilled and promises to toe the company line (The Company Way - Reprise) and Finch is rewarded with a promotion to Junior Executive.

Meanwhile, voluptuous Hedy La Rue is hired as a secretary. Unbeknownst to Bratt, she is Biggley's mistress, and her arrival prompts inappropriate office behaviour until Bratt reminds the men of the rules (A Secretary is Not a Toy).

Rosemary and Smitty unexpectedly meet Finch at the elevator after a long week at the office. Smitty observes their attraction and assists Rosemary in securing a Friday evening dinner date with Finch (Been a Long Day). Frump blackmails Biggley after discovering his affair with Hedy (Been a Long Day – Reprise).

The next day, Finch feigns Old Ivy school spirit to win Biggley's favour (Grand Old Ivy). Assigned Hedy as his secretary, Finch cleverly arranges her to distract Mr. Gatch, securing another promotion.

At an office party for new advertising head Benjamin Burton Daniel Ovington, Rosemary arrives in a new evening dress, (Paris Original). Later, Hedy drunkenly kisses Finch, but he declares his love for Rosemary (Rosemary). Ovington is forced to resign when Biggley learns he went to Old Ivy's rival school. Finch is promoted to Vice President of Advertising and tasked with presenting a bold new campaign. Rosemary agrees to become his secretary, while Frump vows revenge (Act I Finale).

SYNOPSIS

ACT TWO

Tension builds on the morning of Finch's big pitch. The executives await disaster while Rosemary, feeling neglected, resolves to quit. The secretaries convince her that she is living the dream and to give Finch another chance (Cinderella, Darling).

Finch learns from the book that stealing an idea can be useful. Conveniently, Frump proposes a televised treasure hunt—an idea Biggley had already rejected. Finch seizes on it, and though Rosemary is cross, his charm wins her over (Happy to Keep His Dinner Warm – Reprise).

Hedy grows restless with her role, and Biggley pleads with her to stay (Love from a Heart of Gold). Meanwhile, the executives gossip in the washroom, expecting Finch's downfall. Finch, however, boosts his own confidence in the mirror (I Believe in You).

Finch presents the treasure hunt: stock certificates hidden in World Wide Wicket Buildings, with Hedy delivering clues live on television. The stunt launches with a pirate-themed dance number (Pirate Dance). But when forced to swear on a Bible, Hedy accidentally reveals a secret on air, unleashing chaos nationwide.

Rosemary continues to trust Finch (I Believe in You – Reprise). Frump escorts him to the boardroom, where Biggley and chairman Wally Womper demand his resignation. At the last moment, Finch reveals he began as a window washer, cleverly shifts accountability to Frump, and when Womper threatens to fire everyone, Finch rallies the staff around cooperation and unity (Brotherhood of Man).

Bratt is promoted, Frump is dismissed, Biggley remains president, and Womper departs on honeymoon with his new wife - Hedy. Finch is named Chairman of the Board. As he dreams of the presidency, Rosemary reminds him of what matters most, while Frump is left washing windows (Finale).

ERIN JAMES Director

Born and raised in Lake Macquarie, Erin James is a director, performer, and educator whose work spans professional theatre, music theatre, film, cabaret and tertiary education.

As a director, Erin has helmed acclaimed productions for the Very Popular Theatre Company, including Mamma Mia! (2019), Chess (2021) starring Silvie Paladino and David Harris, and Superstars (2024) featuring Marina Prior, Chloe Zuel, Silvie Paladino, and Joshua Robson. She also served as Resident Director for Opera Australia on the national tour of The Phantom of the Opera (2022–23), Staging Supervisor for Julie Andrew's My Fair Lady (2016-17) and was the auditions director for Hadestown (2024).

As a performer, Erin starred in State
Theatre Company of South Australia's 2023
production of Anna Goldsworthy's Welcome
To Your New Life. She was nominated for an
AACTA award for her performance in the
Australian film The Little Death (2014) and
other notable performance highlights include
Australian and international tours of Fiddler
on the Roof, CATS, Love Never Dies, South
Pacific, Blood Brothers and My Fair Lady.

Currently, Erin is Head of Music Theatre at the Elder Conservatorium of Music, where she leads and oversees the Bachelor of Music Theatre Program. Her directorial work in the tertiary sphere includes productions of Cabaret (2021), Les Misérables (2022), On The Town (2023), Shrek (2023), Little Women (2024) and Alice By Heart (2024).

Erin has also trained as an Intimacy Coordinator for stage and screen. She holds a Graduate Diploma of Education (Music) and is proud to champion both established and emerging voices in Australian music theatre.



PAUL SINKINSON Music Director

Paul has extensive show credits as a resident music director for the Elder Conservatorium Bachelor of Music Theatre including *Jesus Christ Superstar* (dir. George Torbay, 2024), *Shrek The Musical* (dir. Erin James, 2023), *In Pieces* (dir. George Torbay, 2022), *Mamma Mia!* (dir. Zoë Komazec-Kermond, 2021), *Songs for a New World* (dir. Mitre Khammash, 2020), and *Spring Awakening* (dir. George Torbay, 2019). He was also music director and mentor for the third-year *Cabaret Project* (2021, 2025).

In 2022, he was the Associate Music Director for the national Australian tour of *Friends!* The Musical Parody (MD. Steven Kramer). He also served as the Music Director for Rachel Beck's South Australian cabaret tour, This Girl (2021), and the Mean Girls Jr development pilot (dir. Erin James, 2021) for the Junior Theatre Festival in Australia. His body of work includes Music Director for the Adelaide Fringe Award-winning cabaret, Not Your Average Asian Girl (dir. Kira Yang, 2022).

Paul's industry experience includes professional keyboard deputy, rehearsal pianist, and pit musician for national tours of *Hairspray The Musical* (MD. Dave Skelton, 2023), 9 to 5 The Musical (MD. James Simpson, 2022), Frozen - The Musical (MD. David Young, 2022), Mamma Mia! (MD. Michael Azzopardi, 2018), Singin' In

The Rain (MD. Adrian Kirk, 2016), and The Sound of Music (MD. Luke Hunter, 2016).

As an accompanist, Paul played for the Australian premiere of the oratorio Considering Matthew Shepard (MD. Jesse Budel, 2019 and 2023), and worked with renowned artists Phillip Quast (2019) and Ruthie Henshall (2019). He has also music directed numerous statebased productions including Wicked, Mary Poppins and Kinky Boots.

Holding a Masters of Secondary Education in Media and Music, Paul works as an Educator and Musical Theatre Music Arranger for *On Stage* at the Adelaide Festival Centre, an open access program of school holiday intensives and workshops for aspiring performers.

Since 2018, Paul has been the Choir Director for the award-winning *Sing for Joy* social choir program with ACH Group, with more than one hundred choir members aged sixty and over attending weekly choir sessions. The program was a finalist in the 2024 HESTA Aged Care Team Excellence Award and has expanded to six community choirs and nine ACH Group residential care homes. The *2023 Pure Imagination* concert highlighted the program's success in combating loneliness and social isolation while celebrating the contributions of older South Australians in the arts.



ALEXANDER KERMOND Choreographer

Zan's first professional engagement was at the age of eight when he appeared as the Young Cosmo Brown in Singin' in the Rain for David Atkins. He later went on to play one of the brothers in the 10th Anniversary Australian tour of Hot Shoe Shuffle, also for David Atkins. Zan's credits include: Candy Man - based on the life of Sammy Davis Jnr with Wayne Scott Kermond, The Kermond 3 Gen Variety Show at the Adelaide Cabaret Festival, Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines' Bravo Performing Arts Cruise, Dein Perry's Tap Dogs at the Dally M Awards, Tony Morwald's Palazzo in Austria and most recently Billy Elliot The Musical for Louise Withers. Zan produced and directed his own show for the Adelaide Fringe Festival, The Vaudevillians. Zan has won two prestigious Mo Awards: Best Entertainer of the Year and Best Variety Production Show for The Kermond 3 Gen Variety Show.

He was also the keynote speaker for the Dream BIG Festival 2023 opening ceremony. In his spare time Joey is a recording artist who has music released on streaming platforms and performs at weddings and events around the Riverland and Adelaide regions.

Miranda Middleton) and Alice by Heart (dir. Erin James). Originally from Melbourne, Nam completed a Musical Theatre Foundational Course at Associated Studios in 2022. In 2023, Nam also performed as a Supernumerary for Swan Lake (Australian Ballet, dir. David Halberg) and A Christmas Carol (dir. David Spencer). Before studying music theatre, Nam studied at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music, specialising in the saxophone.



ERICA JONES (she/her) Smitty / Ensemble

Having just wrapped up *The Cabaret Project*, this will be Erica's fifth production with ECMT. Her most notable roles have been Alice in the 2024 production of *Alice by Heart* (dir. Erin James), Sophia in the Australian premiere of *Vocal Strain* (dir. Joshua Holdyk) at Perth Fringe Festival, her involvement in the music video for Jawbreakers' single *Cheats and Liars* (dir.
