A NOTE FROM THE HEAD OF MUSIC THEATRE

"You should never trust a man who has only one way to spell a word." Mark Twain

Second Year productions have the great liberty of being generously silly. I enjoy selecting works that allow our students the freedom to play without the pressures that come with a Third-Year production. In Second Year there is still time...plenty of time to explore, go to extremes and examine the fine art of comedy. On the surface, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* fulfils that brief. The first production I saw many years ago had me in stitches of laughter. However, the broader issues of 'winning' and 'losing' are deeply important in this work. Set against the backdrop of school life (all schools are bizarre) and the weird construct of family life (all families are bizarre), our students have had the chance to explore this work in a deeper way.

I am indebted to Joseph Simons and Peter Johns for their guidance and creativity on this project. Our students are blessed to work with such enormously talented people. I would like to also thank Chris & Carolina Snape (Lighting) and Jamie Mensforth (Sound). You make these projects a joy for the production team and for our students. We owe you too much!!

For the last six months I have been working on the program of productions and events for 2023. My head is already in next year. The students you are seeing now are soon to be the leaders of this degree and the focus of activities next year. We are excited for you to see them now and urge you to return next year to watch them in our major productions of *ON THE TOWN* in concert with the Elder Conservatorium Symphony Orchestra, *SWEENEY TODD* directed by Helpmann and Green Room Award winner James Millar and A CHORUS LINE with choreography by West End and Australian star Luke Alleva.

It will be a ridiculously fun year!

The challenge: to transform a musical originally written for 9 performers into a production with a cast of 22. Not easy! But with a greater amount people on stage, I've thoroughly appreciated the chance to lean into the more absurd and abstract moments of *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*, while still staying true to the original format and it's message.

Rachel Sheinkin and William Finn's charming tribute to the world of competitive spelling may appear on the surface to simply be a cute nod to adolescence, but it's been a pleasure to dive into this text with the students to discuss the broader metaphor of the spelling bee. What does a 'winner' or a 'loser' look like? How does expectation guide reality? What does fear of failure do to a person's behaviour? - big questions from a quirky, adorable musical!

To populate the stage, we've decided to explore the family life of each of the spellers, hunting through the original text for clues for how to visually illustrate each competitor's homelife. These young characters represent such a range of family circumstances: children of divorce, children of neglect, children of varying socio-economic backgrounds, helicopter parents, parents who have no faith in their child, long-distance parenting, adoption and rainbow families. As a group we've discussed the effects of such upbringings, and how they may inform a child's personality or their approach to competition.

One of the main purposes of the second-year production is to develop in the students a more sophisticated understanding of how a professional rehearsal room works.

"I have been particularly proud of the second-year group for their commitment to learning about double casting, understudies and the team-effort of rehearsing a musical."

Throughout this process they have also learnt about the audition process, project contracts, industry reporting channels and duties of each role within a production crew. No small feat for the students who are also cast members in their own show! The energy and hunger of this group is inspiring.

My thanks to music director, Peter Johns, for making the cast and band sound so wonderful, and to Chris Snape for his excellent lighting design. And of course, to you, audience, for your participation(!) in this production. Whether you are one of our on-stage spellers or not, I thank you for supporting these student's development into the world of professional theatre. I'm sure you'll agree, just like the delightful characters in the musical, they have bright futures ahead of them!

CREATIVES



JOSEPH SIMONS (HE/HIM) DIRECTOR & CHOREOGRAPHER

Joseph is a director and choreographer working in music theatre, contemporary dance, opera, theatre and ballet.

After graduating from Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA), Joseph was awarded 2009 Outstanding Emerging Artist at Australian Dance Awards and nominated for a Green Room Award for Best Male Dancer.

As a performer, he has toured throughout USA, Asia, UK and Australia with companies including West Australian Ballet (*Pinocchio* – title role), Chunky Move (*Connected*, *I Like This*), Lucy Guerin Inc. (*Structure and Sadness, Untrained*), Queensland Ballet (*Little Red*), Force Majeure (*I Will Have Beautiful People At My Funeral Too*), Jack Productions and The Australian Ballet (*El Amour Brujo*). He has performed with The Production Company (*Nice Work If You Can Get It*), Opera Australia (*The Ring Cycle, King Roger*), Victorian Opera (*Julius Caesar*) and developed work at Australian Dance Theatre (*Proximity*) and DV8 Physical Theatre, London (*John*). As an actor, Joseph played Tom in the original London cast of *Spider Love* by Mick Goldstein and created the role of Malcom in the world premiere cast of *The Death Of Kings* by Colette F Keen.

His choreography has been performed by West Australian Ballet (*Man Alive*), Footlight Productions (*Miss Saigon*), The Seven Sopranos (*Popcorn*), Queensland University of Technology (*Skank: A Tragic Love Story*), Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (*Self Destruct*) and Flying Fruit Fly Circus (*Storm*) as well as music videos for Elisha Bones' *Guts* and Hounds Homebound's *Sandy*. Joseph was the recipient of the 2013 Tanja Liedtke Fellowship - awarded to one Australian choreographer every two years.

Following his residency at the International Choreographic Laboratory in Frankfurt, Joseph created his solo work *First Things First*, premiering in the Robert Helpmann Theatre at the Margot Fonteyn Academy in New York. His next play, *100 Years Of The History Of Dance As Told By One Man In 60 Minutes With An Energetic Group Finale*, was written during a development at Roundabout Theatre, New York, before touring extensively.

From 2015 Joseph has been a contributing creative with Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University on shows including Carousel, Little Women, Company, The Wedding Singer, Legally Blonde, Personals, It's Only Life and Elegies.

Joseph directed and choreographed the sold out and extended production of *The Producers* in Brisbane, Queensland. He was the Artistic Director of Altitude Theatre before becoming a full-time lecturer in Music Theatre at Elder Conservatorium, University of Adelaide.



PETER JOHNS (HE/HIM) MUSIC DIRECTOR

Peter is a music theatre repertoire coach, music director, pit orchestra musician, production manager, and stage manager, and has worked on more than 70 productions over the last 25-years. He is the is the founder and executive producer of Irregular Productions and joined the teaching staff at Elder Conservatorium Music Theatre in 2020.

Peter's company Irregular Productions is the co-creator of *Broadway Sessions*, a monthly music theatre performance and curated open-mic night. (www.broadwaysessions.com.au) His company has also staged the South Australian premieres of *Songs for a New World* (dir. Andy Ahrens), *[title of show]* (dir. Hayley Horton) and *Edges* (dir. Ellis Dolan), as well as a new production of *Godspell* (dir. Karen Sheldon) with Lydian Productions.

Outside of theatre, Peter is the music director of Australia's second-largest candlelight Christmas event, Civic Park Carols, broadcast locally on Channel 9, where he has worked with artists including Rachel Beck, Justine Clarke, Guy Sebastian, Jessica Braithwaite, and many contestants from *The Voice*.

Previous show credits include Music Director for Urinetown the Musical, Mamma Mia, Cabaret, Beautiful, Violet, The Story Of My Life, The Light In The Piazza, Les Misérables, Next to Normal, You're A Good Man Charlie Brown, Into the Woods, Beauty and the Beast, [title of show], Edges, Avenue Q, Bring It On, Fiddler on the Roof, Oliver!, Monty Python's Spamalot, Chicago, Sweeney Todd, The Sound of Music, The Witches of Eastwick, Little Shop of Horrors, Seussical the Musical, Grease, Once Upon a Mattress; Associate Music Director for Kinky Boots; and Associate Conductor for City of Angels and RENT.

DECLAN FELDHUSEN (he/him) Vice Principal Panch/ Chip Tolentino (US)




GRACIE ROWLAND (she/her) Logainne Schwartzandgrubenierre
