

Executive Deans' Certificate for Outstanding Academic Achievement

Prize Rules

The *Executive Deans' Certificate for Outstanding Academic Achievement* recognises exceptional academic achievement of undergraduate coursework students in a Faculty of Arts program. The *Executive Deans' Certificate for Outstanding Academic Achievement* replaces the Faculty of Arts Certificates of High Achievement, in recognition of academic achievement from 2020 onwards.

Prize

The Prize shall be called the "Executive Deans' Certificate for Outstanding Academic Achievement" and shall be awarded annually at the end of each academic year to all eligible students.

The Prize will consist of an electronic certificate signed by the Executive Dean, Faculty of Arts.

Eligibility

- To be eligible for the award, candidates must be undergraduate coursework students who have achieved High Distinction (HD) grades in at least 18 units of courses completed under a Faculty of Arts program or programs (if enrolled in multiple Faculty of Arts programs) in the year for which the Certificate is being awarded. This includes study completed during Semesters, Quadesters, Terms, Summer and Winter School.
- Courses completed as Non Award, Cross-Institutional or at Honours level will not be taken into consideration when ascertaining eligibility for the Certificate.

Selection

Eligible students will be ascertained by the Faculty of Arts office on the basis of academic merit in the year for which the prize is being awarded and approved in consultation with the Executive Dean. The certificate will be awarded to all eligible students.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
