### PROGRAM STRUCTURE

<b>UNITS AND LEVELS</b>	You must complete a total of 120 units of courses, with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>at least 12 units and no more than 24 units of Level 1 courses</li> </ul>
<b>INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS</b>	You must complete 30 units of International Relations courses, which includes 15 units of International Relations Closed Electives.
<b>LANGUAGE STUDIES</b>	You must complete at least 9 units in Language Studies, with 6 units of Language at Level 1, and 3 units of Language or Culture at Level 2. Exemptions may apply (see below). You may choose to complete a full language minor (18 units). Available languages: Chinese, French, German, Indonesian, Italian, Modern Greek, Japanese, or Spanish.
<b>ELECTIVES</b>	You must complete no more than 9 units of elective courses. If you complete a full language minor, you replace these 9 elective units with Language courses.
<b>LAW</b>	Law courses are a guide only. Please contact the Adelaide Law School for specific advice. *Law Students are eligible to enrol into any level of Law Elective for which they meet the pre-requisite requirements.

### THINGS TO NOTE

- The course lists for closed electives, minors and languages can be found on the Faculty of Arts website.
- A course is usually worth 3 units, with some worth 6, 9 or 12. Information about all courses can be found in Course Planner.
- Some courses have restrictions and/or prerequisites (i.e. other courses you must complete first) - check Course Planner to make sure you meet these, if applicable.
- You are exempt from completing the language component if you are an International student, are studying a Diploma in Languages, or are studying a language major/minor in another degree. Students who are exempt from study must complete International Relations Closed Electives or a different language.
- If you think you might like to undertake an internship or go on exchange, plan early in your degree so you don't miss out.
