
The David Hunter Music Education Prize

Establishment

This Prize was established in 2023 by a donation to the University from David Hunter, who is a long-time supporter of music students at Marryatville High School, where he established the David Hunter Scholarship for outstanding music students. David decided to support students in their music learning pathway through to the Elder Conservatorium by establishing a prize that would support Elder Conservatorium of Music students to complete the final year of their studies.

In support of the prize, the donor has agreed to donate the prize amount of \$5,000 for the prize to be awarded annually for five years from 2024-202028.

The Prize will no longer be awarded if the donor ceases financial support of the Prize.

Title

1. The Prize shall be called the "David Hunter Music Education Prize".

Value

2. The Prize shall be awarded annually and the value of the Prize will be \$1,000.00 paid in one lump sum direct to the student. The funds are to provide assistance for materials, lessons or other expenses required for the student's final year of study.

Eligibility

3. To be eligible for the prize, candidates must be undertaking their final year of the Bachelor of Music or Bachelor of Music (Advanced) at the University of Adelaide in the year for which the prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

4. The prize will be awarded to the candidate who demonstrates outstanding talent, academic achievement, and musical potential as determined by the Director of the Elder Conservatorium of Music.
5. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the funds may be used in a subsequent year (or as agreed with the donor).
6. If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize may be shared equally.
